Introduction to Healthcare

Tracy Centracchio is BTC's Introduction to Healthcare teacher, and she starts off each day welcoming students with a warm smile and a chance to review content from the day before, before diving into the next exciting, hands-on activity. One of Tracy's favorite parts of teaching is the way that students light up when they make a connection between their classroom learning and their real-world experiences. After 28 years as a nurse, teaching Introduction to Healthcare is her dream job, and she hopes that her students feel seen, valued and celebrated for their unique stories and backgrounds.

Throughout the one-year program, students will learn patient care skills training and medical assessment techniques as well as 32 hours of clinical training. At the end of the school year, students have the opportunity to take Licensed Nursing Assistant (LNA) exam, as well as interview with prospective employers.
